Contraceptive Training Specialist - Consultant

The Contraceptive Training Specialist will lead trainings for health care providers and work with national and community partners to advance health equity with the Beyond the Pill program at the Bixby Center for Global Reproductive Health at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) School of Medicine. A key goal of our training program is to increase the capacity of healthcare providers to offer the full range of contraceptive methods, including the contraceptive implant and intrauterine devices. We are committed to promoting patient autonomy through training medical staff to conduct non-directive, patient-centered counseling, informed by a reproductive justice framework and to facilitate patient access to prompt device removal upon request.

As a consultant member of our team, you will be invited to facilitate and lead trainings on contraceptive methods, patient education and counseling skills, as well as topics such as implicit bias and cultural humility, for under-resourced and publicly-funded health centers as well as abortion-care settings. Trainings are currently being conducted virtually; we will eventually resume in-person trainings across the United States, and occasional travel may be involved (travel expenses will be reimbursed). There will also be opportunities to contribute to the development of training curriculum and educational materials.

Our ideal applicant brings experience as an engaging speaker and dynamic group facilitator, specifically with experience leading trainings for medical providers and staff. Additionally, interested individuals should bring a strong foundation in reproductive justice and racial equity as well as experience working with marginalized populations, including communities of color and LGBTQIA clients. Candidates should have at minimum a Bachelor's degree in a related field of study, at least four years of combined experience working in the reproductive health and/or social justice fields, including at least one year of direct client service provision in a reproductive health setting.

This is a remote position with variable hours and flexible time commitment.

(5 to 20 hours per month, depending on training needs and consultant availability.)
